ANDREW SMITH assumed the duties and responsibilities as the Assistant Director (AD) of the United States Marshals Service (USMS) Tactical Operations Division (TOD) in December 2019. In this capacity, AD Smith oversees the USMS crisis response programs as well as national security and contingency programs. AD Smith leads a geographically dispersed staff that protects the Judiciary, responds to national emergencies and crises involving Homeland Security, and supports USMS operations spanning a wide and varied range of federal law enforcement missions ordered by the President and United States Attorney General.

Prior to leading TOD, AD Smith served as the Deputy Assistant Director (DAD) of the United States Marshals Service (USMS) Investigative Operations Division (IOD). In that capacity, AD Smith oversaw specialized support to investigations including the International Investigations Branch composed of multiple foreign field offices and liaison to INTERPOL, Organized Crime and Gangs Branch, Criminal Intelligence Branch and the Technical Operations Group which also entails the Air Surveillance Branch.
